Dear EFPA colleagues and members!

As you all know, on February 24, 2022, the Russian Federation attacked Ukraine under the false idea of protecting the civilians of the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine (the so-called DNR and LNR). Russian troops have been bombing our peaceful towns and villages for five days, women, children and even animals. The Russian army is destroying our military infrastructure in order to disable our chances to defend ourselves. But even this is not enough for them, "peacekeeper" fire rockets are aimed at homes, hospitals, kindergartens, schools, zoos. The occupiers took hold of the Chornobyl nuclear power plant. The civilians hide in basements and bomb shelters every day; they survive, get sick and give birth there.

It is difficult to describe everything we see and experience every day. Our love for our land, people, and sense of dignity makes us defend ourselves. The citizens of Ukraine are resisting the invaders in various ways; we are defending ourselves with weapons, conducting information protection, and seeking diplomatic support. The main goal of these actions is to save lives and health. Members of the National Psychological Association work 24/7 to support our citizens, help them cope with anxiety, panic, and help the families of our defenders and citizens to grieve. Together with true friends from Psychological Associations in other countries, we launch psychological support networks for Ukrainian refugees. It is difficult to imagine how much work awaits us after the war, which will undoubtedly end with our victory.

In 2019, many of you visited peaceful Kyiv. We are sure that you had a wonderful time with friendly people who share democratic values and use psychology to develop prosperity, peace, equality, and respect for each other and other nations.
